You may have read information on STEM and STEAM learning. The Catholic Schools of the Diocese of Venice are moving to STREAM for our students. The difference is the addition of religion, faith, and ethics. We will be integrating project learning, which will include Science, Technology, Religion, Engineering, Art, and Math. STREAM projects encourage higher order thinking and creative problem solving. We will be integrating lessons from Engineering is Elementary which was developed by the Boston Museum of Science with the National Center for Technological Literacy, as well as Lockheed Martin's Engineers in the Classroom, and other resources. Our summer camps demonstrated how exciting hands on learning can be for our students.

Grades 3, 4, and 5 will have iPads to use in the classrooms this year. We will also be setting up iPad learning stations in grades PK – 2. The Middle School will continue with the Bring Your Own Device program for this school year.
